THE STORY OF PEACHTREE

On a spring day in 1910, on the way home from the funeral of their three-month-old son, Mr. and Mrs. C. S. and Ida Honour saw the children of the Buckhead neighborhood playing, and recognized they did not have a place to learn about Jesus. In memory of their son, they started a Sunday school for the children in the neighborhood. That mission Sunday School for youth subsequently grew into a full congregation, which was chartered November 3, 1919, as Peachtree Road Presbyterian Church.

Over time, Peachtree grew with the neighborhood, and eventually moved to its current location in May 1960, dropping Road from its name. In its current location, the church has continued to thrive, and in the late 2000s completed a building project which expanded the campus to 26 total acres, with facilities on both sides of Roswell Road in the growing Buckhead area of Atlanta.

The story of the Honour family is the genesis story of Peachtree and continues to inspire our mission today.

Unexpected Togetherness

From the beginning, Peachtree has placed a high value on the body of Christ that is multiple ages and generations, all worshipping and joining together for fellowship.

Peachtree continues this tradition today with programs and activities for people of all ages, even as we continue to grow younger. The total number of people under Peachtree's care, including all ages, is over 10,200 people, with the official membership of confirmation age adults over 7,000 and growing. Fourteen percent of Peachtree are from birth to ten years old and fifteen percent are over 66 years, making this a wonderfully symmetrical

multi-generational congregation. The average age at Peachtree is 37 years old, and we have more nine year olds than any other age.

With 100+ year church history, God continues to bring all ages to Peachtree for Unexpected Togetherness.

Gentle Reverence

By establishing a Sunday school, the Honors understood the power of changing lives of the young children of Buckhead by enriching their minds.

Today, Peachtree continues to believe in the importance of sharing and studying the gospel which has the power to transform us and our culture. The foundation of this belief is a commitment to share scripture with the love of Jesus Christ.

In our current climate, it is too often the case that churches are either confrontational in their emphasis on doctrine or in an effort to appear loving, they are neglectful of our need for change and growth. Peachtree believes that it is crucial to be committed to both truth and grace.

Disruptive Compassion

The Honour family saw a neighborhood that needed Jesus and acted to make a difference. Throughout its history and continuing today, we at Peachtree have sought to serve the most vulnerable in Atlanta and around the world.

We partner with a number of organizations that seek to restore the lives of vulnerable children, including LaAmistad, our after school program for Latino students that has now been replicated in ten other locations. In addition, we have built 154 Habitat for Humanity homes, and provide life insurance for every Atlanta Police Officer and Fireman.


The Honours' calling now extends through efforts such as education and fighting human trafficking in a dozen countries around the world.

Peachtree continues to build on the foundation of the Honours' legacy by joining Christ daily in the restoration of all things.

PRESBYTERIAN

The word "Presbyterian" comes from the Greek word *presbuteros*, which means "elder." This concept defines our system of church government, which is structured around a group of elders elected by the congregation. This is the same system of government upon which our country's democratic philosophies were founded. To be Presbyterian also means we are Presbyterian or "Reformed" in our theology. Reformed theology is a systematic way of understanding Christian beliefs. These essential beliefs include the sovereignty of God, salvation through faith in Jesus Christ alone, the authority of the Bible for faith and life, and our individual duty to be a minister of Christ at all times and in all places.

Presbyterians trace our history to the 16th century and the Protestant Reformation. Our theological heritage begins with the French lawyer, John Calvin (1509–1564), whose writings crystallize reformed theology. The first American Presbytery was organized in 1706. Presbyterians are distinctive in two ways: we are Reformed in our theology and connectional in our polity.



On average, we send out 12 mission trips annually to serve alongside our global partners and to be a part of God's work around the world.

One of the most important moments in Rich's life was when the Christian faith moved from being an idea of God to a relationship with God. Prior to coming to Peachtree, Rich served as Lead Pastor at St.

Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Newport Beach, California for seven years. He graduated cum laude with his Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration from Trinity University in San Antonio, where he currently serves as a member of the board of trustees. He earned a Master of Divinity from Princeton Theological Seminary. He served as a member of the board of trustees for Princeton from 2010 to 2012. He also received his Doctorate of Ministry from Fuller Theological Seminary and is currently serving the school as a member of the board of trustees.

Rich is a native Texan and is married to his wife Kelly. Kelly also has her Master of Divinity from Princeton, which is where the couple met.
